 Antidegradation debate moves to floor of Senate

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2011 Legislative Reports

Today marks the 57th legislative day. The process is on schedule, moving steadily, but slowly forward while the budget remains the dominant issue. The biggest budgets have to yet set and there is concern that Education and Health & Welfare potentially face additional cuts. But, based on the last 10 years of writing this report, it seems that by now we would usually have more legislation to follow and more to report on.

Most legislation, including Idaho Department of Water Resources and Department of Environmental Quality's, is moving through the House and Senate with little or no opposition. The possible exception is fees. While it is only an observation, it appears that, at least in the House of Representatives, any proposed fee increase is being met with opposition by roughly one-third of the representatives. It appears that 20 to 25 votes out of 70 are being cast against any proposed fee. While it has not been a problem so far, it could become one in the Senate if there is pressure from stakeholders.

While waiting for the budget process to move forward, there is an opportunity to become better acquainted with new legislators. There are 20 newly-elected or appointed representatives and senators out of 105, accounting for roughly 19%. New legislators, collectively but not necessarily individually, appear to be somewhat more conservative than their predecessors or perhaps it is just indicative of the economic situation.

The Antidegradation rule and its companion bill, HO153, received a hearing today in the Senate Resource & Environment Committee. The rule was approved with certain sections rejected through concurrent resolution while the bill reported out with a "Do Pass" recommendation. The vote was 7 to 2 along party lines. In addition to testimony from Idaho Association of Commerce and Industry, several stakeholder groups testified about the negotiated rulemaking process and their concerns about potential impacts to cities and industry. Justin Hayes, Idaho Conservation League (ICL), advised the committee that, in their opinion, it was questionable as to whether the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) would approve the changes. He said that adopting the rule and bill as presented would likely result in further legal action from ICL.
