2011 State of the State and Budget Address: Governor Otter called for "statesmanship" and "sound public policy" from new and returning legislators. In the coming months they must reconcile a state revenue shortfall of over \$300 million with what Otter termed a a "modest but responsible 3-percent growth rate. In this budget go-around there are no federal stimulus dollars or reserve accounts to fill the gaps. But, citing \$415,000 here and \$1 million there, about \$78 million has been identified in state coffers to offset the revenue shortfall. Most state agencies could face 2-percent and possibly even 4-percent as Otter vowed to protect public education. He also asked legislators to encourage economic development by promoting a business climate that will stimulate hiring and investment.

Idaho Water Supply "Cautiously Optimistic": At its first meeting in the new water year, the Idaho Water Supply Committee sees a "La Nina" pattern continuing to the benefit of snowpacks, reservoir storage and summer irrigation.

Treasure Valley Comprehensive Aquifer Management Process (CAMP): The drivers in the Treasure Valley CAMP are future and potential water conflicts, unlike the very present and real conflicts on the Eastern Snake Plain, leaving this Advisory Committee to struggle with a sense of purpose. They began their January 7th meeting by discussing and drafting a vision statement. The Committee is facing a self-imposed March deadline to finalize its recommendations to the Idaho Water Resource Board (IWRB).

Rathdrum Prairie and ESPA CAMP: The IWRB should be receiving a final report from the Rathdrum Prairie CAMP Advisory Board soon. Meanwhile, the ESPA CAMP remains bogged down in funding, leaving some to question whether or not the Implementation Committee can move forward. Those who remain committed to the process indicate that the original concept of a large, regional entity may be replaced by collaborative efforts of smaller, more local entities committed to putting projects on the ground.

Legislation & Rules: Most water-related legislation vetted for this session appears to be mostly housekeeping with one significant exception, an Department of Environmental Quality (IDEQ) rule establishing an Anti-degradation Implementation Policy for Idaho. In an unusual move to garner support from stakeholders, IDEQ will attempt to draft guidance at the same time that the negotiated rule is presented to the legislature. It is questionable whether or not this rule will survive the session even with their support. Without the rule, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency could be forced to impose its own rule due to a lawsuit filed last year against that agency by the Idaho Conservation League. The Guidance Committee met for the first time last week, beginning its work on Chapter 6 "General Permits". IDEQ's rules are up for review in the House and Senate, on Tuesday (1/18/11) and Wednesday (1/19/11).
