2011 Legislative Reports

BUDGETS: Several education funding bills were printed in the Senate last Friday and H&W funding bills are being drafted, possibly paving the way for adjournment <u>or not</u>. Much will depend on how contentious those funding bills are in the Legislature and for the public. Differences of opinion within the Republican caucuses of both Houses could become potentially divisive. If that occurs, it could lead to a longer session. However, legislators who may individually object to cuts in education and Health & Welfare also know that major tax increases are not an option.

WIND: In the meantime, wind energy is generating considerable debate at the Statehouse. Two bills are currently being considered: HO250 would extend a sales tax rebate aimed at encouraging alternative energy development, including wind, and HO265 would place a moratorium on wind development in Idaho. The House Revenue and Taxation Committee has asked stakeholders to find a compromise on the sales tax rebate while State Affairs is holding hearings on the moratorium.

Over 1300 megawatts (MWs) of wind are being developed in Idaho. Supporters see wind as an environmentally-friendly opportunity for a state that imports over 50% of our electricity to become more self-reliant. Detractors say that our electricity rates, already among the lowest in the nation, will increase dramatically and property values adjacent to wind farms will be lowered.

The wind does not blow all the time so utilities must back-up wind with energy sources like hydropower, coal or natural gas to ensure reliability and build transmission to deliver it. Integrating wind (backing up and delivering it) increases its cost and the overall cost of electricity, all of which is passed on to ratepayers.

Idaho Power expects to bring over 900 MWs of wind on-line in the next few years. Last week they held a Wind Integration Workshop to outline an expedited study they are undertaking to determine what those costs and impacts could be to their customers. They hope to include an executive summary of their results in their 2011 Integrated Resource Plan (IRP) in June and finalize the study in July.

IDAHO SUPREME COURT RULING: A much awaited Idaho Supreme Court decision to decide issues between spring users and ground water users in the Magic Valley was released last week. While the Supreme Court affirmed the District Court's judgment, it also noted in its final order that all parties prevailed in part. While a more in-depth analysis is not yet available, affirming the District court's decision means nothing has really changed for ground water users since July 2008. The original water delivery call dates to 2005 and has been the subject of administrative hearings before Idaho Department of Water Resources, district court actions, and finally the appeal to the Idaho Supreme Court. Two similar appeals to the Supreme Court are expected to follow this case in 2011, one relating to a water delivery calls involving ground water users and the Surface Water Coalition; the other stemming from a water delivery call from A&B Irrigation District water delivery call.
