# **Appropriation Bills Begin to Report Out**

Appropriation bills began reporting out of the Joint Finance & Appropriations Committee (JFAC) last week, a sure sign that spring and adjournment are on the horizon. Issues still to be resolved include putting the legislature's stamp of approval on CAMP. CAMP has run into some problems that, while not entirely unexpected, have turned out to be more serious than previously anticipated.

IDWR's budget was set Friday, March 20th. The Department faces an overall decrease of 10.2% in 2010. The good news is that there are no staff reductions, but some staff members will be reassigned.

Last week Vince Alberdi, Leondard Beck, Roger Chase and Terry Uhling appeared in the Senate Resource & Environment Committee for confirmation hearings. The committee voted today, Monday March 23rd, to confirm all four appointments. A vote of full Senate will follow, possibly as early as Wednesday or Thursday of this week.

Seeing the budget-setting process underway is a positive sign that the session is moving toward adjournment, even though it is probably still at least several weeks away. A major and contentious hurdle must be addressed in the form of transportation funding.

A reminder to all Irrigation Pumpers: The annual meeting is scheduled for 10 a.m. on Thursday, March 26th, at Racine Law Offices in Pocatello.

IGWA's Executive Committee will meet at 1 p.m. on March 26th, also at Racine Law Offices.
