Mitigation Plan Submitted; CAMP Vote Postponed; IWRB Appointees To Be Confirmed; Budget Setting Begins

IGWA submitted a Mitigation Plan that it hopes will forestall curtailment of 41,000 ground water acres in the Magic Valley with a plan submitted to IDWR on Friday. The Director must now decide to accept the plan.

The House Resource and Conservation Committee delayed action on H0210 (Comprehensive Aquifer Management Plan) until this week. The committee delayed action on the bill first until March 17th and now March 19th. The delay accommodates drafting amendments proposed last week by the Idaho Water Users' Legislative Committee. Proposed amendments reference the formation of an Implementation Committee and fee structure that are outlined in the Plan, but not in the bill as currently written.

The Senate Resource & Environment Committee will hold confirmation hearings on Friday for three Idaho Water Resource Board appointees:

board chairman Terry Uhling, current board member Leonard Beck and recent appointee Vince Alberdi. Alberdi's appointment raises the hackles of many ground water users. As the retired general manager of the Twin Falls Canal Company, he has been vocal in calling for a strict interpretation of the prior appropriation doctrine, curtailment of junior water users, and his unenthusiastic support for CAMP. If adopted by the legislature as it is expected to be, IWRB will be charged with implementing and funding CAMP. It is unclear as yet whether IGWA will support or oppose Alberdi's appointment.

A fourth appointee, Roger Chase, may also be confirmed. Chase, a former legislator and current mayor of Pocatello, is expected to bring an understanding of the importance of the CAMP process to Eastern Idaho's economy and municipal ground water users to the board .

JFAC resumed its budget setting agenda today after revising its schedule to review the federal stimulus package. Idaho Office of Energy Resources and the Public Utilities Commission's budgets were addressed to day. Idaho Department of Environmental Quality is tentatively scheduled for Wednesday and Idaho Department of Water Resources for Friday.
