Legislative Reports 2007

ESPA Framework & Draft State Energy Plan Hearings Scheduled

CDR will present its report on the Eastern Snake Plain Management Plan Framework to a joint meeting of the House Resource & Conservation Committee and the Senate Resource & Environment Committee on Monday, February 19th. The meeting will start at 1:30 p.m. in the Gold Room with an introduction from Idaho Water Resource Board Chairman Jerry Rigby. No public testimony will be taken.

The Joint Finance & Appropriations Committee will begin setting the state's budget today. JFAC completed its hearing process on Friday, February 16th. The hearing process involves reviewing each agency's budget requests along with the Governor's proposals and recommendations from Germane Committee Chairmen. The budget setting process is expected to be completed on or around March 9th.

On Tuesday, the House Environment, Energy & Technology Committee will hold a Gold Room hearing on the Draft State Energy Plan. The hearing begins at 1:30 p.m. Public comment will be taken.

Idaho Ground Water Appropriators, Inc. hosted a successful legislative leadership dinner on February 13th at Leku Ona. In all over 30 legislators and their wives joined representatives from the ground water users for a Basque dinner and presentations relating to ground water modeling, recharge, and mitigation plans. Guests included House Speaker Denney, Senate President Pro Tem Robert Geddes, majority and minority leaders from both bodies, and committee chairmen or vice chairmen from the Agriculture and Resource Committees.

This legislative session continues to benignly amble its way toward a late March conclusion at least on the surface. However, some signs of discontent are working their way into the process. One North Idaho legislator offered up proposed funding for the North Idaho Adjudication as one option for addressing other IDWR needs, saying an adjudication there is not wanted.

In other developments, Dairymen presented a separate mitigation plan to the Governor's office last week. Surface water users are reportedly dismayed by IDWR's latest proposal to negotiate and mitigate a settlement on the ESPA for 2007. Negotiations will resume this week in Jerome.
