

# Legislative Reports 2007

# Otter Expected to Convene Water Summit

Nothing this session is likely to generate the interest, controversy or relief that follows last week's Idaho Supreme Court decision. Gone is the speculation about how that decision or lack of a decision would impact the agricultural community this year along with the talk of a possible special session.

Legislators will be briefed next week on the decision once the Idaho Attorney General's office has completed their analysis. As the state and water users sort out how to proceed in its aftermath, Governor Otter appears to be moving ahead with his campaign promise to convene a water summit. According an article in the Twin Falls Times-News last week, the summit could be scheduled while the Legislature is still in Boise. No further information is available at this time.

Meanwhile legislators are preparing to wrap up this session. The Joint Finance and Appropriation Committee (JFAC) adjourned last week subject to the call of the chair, signaling that its work on the state's budgets is mostly completed. They will continue to meet—and already have—as needed. Committees are winding down. Sine die parties are being planned for this week although most speculate that the session will end on or around March 23rd.

It has been, for the most part, an uneventful session devoted primarily to housekeeping issues: technical corrections, minor amendments, rules, taxes. The Natural Resource Interim Committee was re-authorized to meet over the summer and could address on-going water issues, including aquifer management throughout the state. The Energy Interim Committee will continue as well, focusing its efforts on implementing action items outlined in the new State Energy Plan and trying to resolve some of the more controversial aspects of that plan, siting being the most prominent.
