Constitutionality of Conjunctive Management Rules

The Idaho Supreme Court issued its much awaited opinion on the conjunctive management rules today, March 5, 2007, overturning Judge Wood's decision. In a press release issued by the Court, the justices ruled in brief that:

- 1. The Conjunctive Management Rules are constitutional.
- 2. The procedural requirements, such as proper presumptions, burdens of proof and evidentiary standards are incorporated by reference in the Rules.
- 3. It is not facially unconstitutional to ask a senior water rights holder to provide information necessary to the Director's determination of whether material injury had occurred, although that does not permit shifting the burden to the the senior to re-prove or re-adjudicate his right.
- 4. The Director has some discretion to determine whether carryover water is reasonably necessary for future needs.
- 5. Pocatello did not have intervener status.

In other legislative action last week, the House State Affairs Committee printed Concurrent Resolution 28 to continue funding the Eastern Snake Plan Aquifer Management Plan. About half of the \$850,000 appropriation would be used for technical studies to support the plan while the remainder is designated for plan development. Idaho Water Resource Board estimates the entire process can be completed in 16 months.

Legislators are working behind the scenes to find an additional \$10 million for a general fund appropriation that would allow the Water Board to purchase spring user water rights mainly in the 1000 Springs area under a subordination or willing buyer/willing seller agreement. In the Water Board's opinion this is a necessary action. Spring flows are not anticipated to ever return to the artificially high levels of the 1960/1970's when many of these rights were issued.
